As is the case every year it seems, the CSI women's basketball team became a team to watch in 2008-09. With all starters intact from the previous year, the team felt it could only get better. The Dolphins had an incredible season, finishing with a 23-6 overall record and a 12-1 CUNYAC record. For the eleventh consecutive time, the Dolphins took the CUNYAC South Division title.

After defeating CCNY in the opening round of the CUNYAC Tournament the Dolphins faced Lehman College. Though they beat Lehman during the regular season, CSI could not grab a hold in the semifinals, suffering a 58-51 loss.

For the fourth consecutive season, the Dolphins advanced to the ECAC Metro NY/NJ Tournament earning the eight-team tournament's No. 1 seed, the first time ever in program history. The top seed allowed the Dolphins to host every leg of the tournament. The team faced No. 8 seeded Purchase College in the quarterfinal round where they took an 85-72 victory. Next up, the Dolphins hosted the No. 5 seeded College of St. Elizabeth at Xaverian High School to capture a 68-50 victory. CSI was ready for what was up next, a chance to avenge a loss against Lehman College. CSI hosted Lehman, the first time the teams have met in the ECAC tournament, and snagged a 75-71 triumph for their first ECAC Metro title Championship.

As well as earning Outstanding Player of the Game in the ECAC Championship, Nicole Estrada was named to the Division III Metro Women's Basketball All Star Second Team and was named a CUNYAC First Team All-Star. She finished her career with 1,588 points good enough for second best in CSI history. Senior Megan Sullivan also received a CUNYAC All-Star nod and was voted to the Second All-Met Division III team.

The Dolphins will lose five key seniors coming into the 2009-2010 season but will strive to earn back the CUNYAC Championship title that has been five years removed from the program.

Marguerite Moran
Head Coach

Having just completed her eleventh season with the Dolphins, Marguerite Moran has enjoyed an already distinguished career at the helm of the CSI women's basketball program. She has led the Dolphins to the CUNYAC title game in all but four years

under her guidance, taking the championship and advancing to the NCAA Division III postseason tournament three times. She is the school's all-time winningest women's basketball coach, posting a 223-91 (.710) record with the Dolphins. CSI's regular season mark of 113-17 (.869) within the CUNYAC is the best mark of any basketball team, men's or women's of this decade.

Moran's illustrious head coaching career began in 1990 at Long Island University. At the time, she was the youngest NCAA Division I women's basketball head coach, at just 22 years of age. She spent nine seasons with the Blackbirds, building her knowledge of the game while preaching the importance of academics and a life beyond basketball at every turn.

Prior to her coaching career, Moran was a decorated player at Hofstra University. A prolific three-point shooter who was yearly among the nation's leaders, she set school records for points in a season and in a single game during her three-year career.

A local product, Moran had a standout career at Bishop Kearney High School in Brooklyn, NY. A three-time CUNYAC Coach of the Year, she was named to the Bishop Kearney Hall of Fame in 2002.
